Cadet Henry Roberts, recently completed a gliding scholarship course at RAF Little Rissington, and has proved to be a promising pilot.



He completed his scholarship with his first solo flight (yes on his own) in a Vigilant motor glider, and has been recommended for an Advanced Glider Training course.

Roberts has also been recommended for a Flying scholarship which will help him on his way to a private pilots licence.

All cadets at 1289 get the chance to fly at least four times every year, and scholarships are available to those over 16. We expect three more cadets to complete Gliding scholarships in 2006.

Cadet Sergeant Ashleigh Smith spent a week in February training and performing with the Air Cadets National Concert Band, at RAF College Cranwell.
